Breed Rescue Guidelines

1. Rescue in cases of emergency immediately. The following constitutes an emergency:
 - In a Humane Society/Shelter
 - In an animal hospital to be put down
 - Wandering loose
 - Death or illness in family
 - Bites
 - Allergies
2. Rescues must live in Wisconsin or have been bred in Wisconsin IN ALL CASES where the CWVC will take financial responsibility.
3. There is a 2-month waiting period in all other cases where the CWVC will try to find a home prior to fostering. A rescue committee member will do a home visit to evaluate the dog. The dog must be placed at no charge with adoptee unless the fee is donated to the CWVC Rescue Fund. The fee will be agreed upon at the home visit. A \$25 fee will be charged if the CWVC takes the dog after 2 months if an adoptive home cannot be found. The dog must be spayed or neutered before coming into Breed Rescue.
4. The breeder of the dog must be contacted by the owner or the CWVC foster home.
5. Any dogs taken outside these guidelines must be agreed upon through the CWVC Rescue Committee or must be handled by the individual taking in the rescue with expenses reimbursed through the VCA.
6. The rescued Vizsla must be deemed adoptable by members of the CWVC Rescue Committee before being placed.
