

CWVC Guidelines
Public Representation Guidelines

Last Updated: February 10, 2006

Overview:

With the goal of educating the public about the breed, performance events and the Club, the CWVC may staff a booth at various functions such as State Fairs, Pet Fairs, Hunting or Sporting Expositions, Event Days and other similar events. Keeping the purpose of these events fully in mind and in an effort to limit the liability of the club, the following guidelines are set forth:

Guidelines:

- 1) The CWVC representatives must be good stewards of the breed. Both the positives and negatives of the breed should be discussed as it relates to the venue being exhibited.
- 2) All dogs and puppies used as demo dogs must be fully immunized against disease with standard accepted immunization protocols.
- 3) Dogs or puppies showing signs of stress must immediately be attended to by placing them in a crate or removing them from the premises. This is to protect both the dog and the public.
- 4) No personal business or kennel cards shall be displayed or offered to the public while acting as a representative of the CWVC (i.e. in a booth).
- 5) Puppy referrals should be directed to the CWVC Breeder Referral Chairperson whose number is listed on the official CWVC Brochure, "How to Find a Quality Vizsla and a Reputable Breeder." This brochure will be provided to booth staff and will be available via the CWVC Web Site which is listed on the back of all brochures.
- 6) While acting as a representative of the club (i.e. in a booth), no puppies may be sold, no deposits can be taken on upcoming litters, nor may verbal contracts or commitments be obtained from potential puppy purchasers.
- 7) In the case of running and operating a booth, at least one person present should be a voting member of the CWVC.
