CWVC Breeder Referral is a service provided to assist puppy buyers with finding a Vizsla breeder. Breeders who are members in good standing with the CWVC, are invited to have their contact information listed on our Breeder Referral List. The Breeder Referral List contains names, addresses, phone numbers and email. The CWVC does not endorse, recommend nor guarantee any particular breeder whether on the list or not.

To be placed on the Breeder Referral list, CWVC members must sign and comply with the terms of the <u>CWVC Breeder Listing Guidelines</u>. This form can be accessed on the CWVC website in the Members Only section, or you can request an electronic copy by emailing the Breeder Referral Chair. Completed and signed forms are to be sent to the Breeder Referral Chair either by email or USPS mail. Breeders must sign a new form every 5 years and commit to informing the Breeder Referral Chair when they are having a litter.

The breeders on the CWVC Breeder List are committed to uphold and comply with the terms and conditions of the <u>CWVC Breeder Listing Guidelines</u>. The CWVC relies on the ethics and honesty of individual breeders. Puppy buyers are still encouraged though to take steps to ensure the breeder is reputable as described in <u>How to Find a Quality Vizsla and Reputable Breeder</u>. If the CWVC receives negative reports of a breeder not honoring the signed Breeder Listing Guidelines, there will be an investigation and the breeder will be removed from the list if the report is found to be true.

The CWVC does NOT provide referrals for stud dogs/sires or brood bitches/dams for breeding purposes. The selection of an appropriate mate depends on the traits and ancestry of each individual dog and potential mate as described in <a href="Should I Breed My Vizsla?">Should I Breed My Vizsla?</a> and in the <a href="Breeder Guidelines">Breeder Guidelines</a>. The CWVC does not have the resources to spend hours doing the research that should be done by the owner and/or breeder of the dog.
